## I'm Dreaming of a Blue Christmas?

Elvis Presley, the King of Rock'n'Roll, once sang, 'I'll have a blue Christmas without you'. His 'Blue Christmas' made the UK charts in 1964, and its surprising popularity was perhaps because it expresses sentiments that many people can identify with. Christmas isn't always happy for everyone.

Christmas can be a painful time, even though we sing "Tis the season to be jolly". For my family it'll be a mixed celebration this year – twelve months ago our little grandson Dylan was very ill, and died in January, so this will be our first Christmas without him. I know it's not just us, either. In our parishes we have had several tragic deaths that rocked our villages this year – Tilly Seccombe and Harry Purcell, Nick Foster and others come to mind. Further afield we are aware of the situation and the suffering in Ukraine and Israel/Gaza. It can sometimes feel that there's not so much to be jolly about.

So this year we are holding a 'Longest Night' service at Ilmington Church on 21 December, at 7.00pm – open to anyone from across the parishes. It will be a short (45 minute) service with the opportunity for silence, reflection, quiet music and few words. Amongst the Carols and mince pies I hope it will be an opportunity for those who may struggle a bit with the jollity of Christmas to know that God is in the blue times too. I hope we might extend this service to some of our other churches next year if it seems to catch people's imaginations.

At the heart of our Christmas celebrations, though it can easily be lost, is the story of two wandering parents and a baby born in a stable for want of anywhere better. The circumstances of the birth of Jesus were hard, yet for Christians it is a sign that God is with us – even in the darkest of situations. Holding on to the sense that God shares our 'Blue Christmases' as well as our joyful ones may be what matters for many of us this year.

**Update on Appointment of Associate Minister** 

Since Stephen and Jean Fletcher moved to Birmingham in November 2022 we have been without an Associate Minister in our group of parishes. Unfortunately, after Stephen and Jean left there was a major flood in Tredington Rectory and the house has required major work to dry it out and then repair the extensive damage, all tied to a complex insurance claim.

I gather that the house should be ready to be occupied again sometime after the end of January 2024, so I hope that we will be able to advertise for a clergyperson to fill the vacant Associate Minister post around that time, with the appointment taking effect from Easter 2024. The post is unpaid, though the house is provided free in exchange for up to 3 days' work a week, including Sundays, and would suit someone recently retired, or looking for a break from full—time ministry, or who has another job—if you know anyone who might be interested, please let them know.

Traditional images at Christmas show Mary and Joseph travelling to Bethlehem with Mary riding on a donkey. The donkey is known as a beast of burden and can be seen in other countries carrying heavy loads. They are highly intelligent, sociable and calm, capable of independent thinking and decision making. Their large ears help to keep them cool. Donkeys are known for being obstinate, planting their feet and staying put regardless of how hard a handler pulls. This is because they may sense danger so will stand their ground giving them time to make their own decision about whether or not it's safe to keep going forward. Donkeys can be naturally aggressive towards foxes, jackals, wolves etc so they are sometimes used as protection for livestock. The livestock see the donkeys as protectors and gravitate toward them when sensing danger. These creatures are are a wonderful blessing to us. Happy Christmas evervone.

'HELP' to Keep the Churchyard Maintained 'Men and boys: HELP!' That call went out from the rector to the parish at Christmas, 1861. St Mary's Whitchurch was due to reopen at New Year's after substantial restoration and renovation. But torrential rains had made a quagmire of the churchyard which only that August had benefited from an enlargement, a gift of additional land from the West Estate at Alscot Park. It looked like the reopening would be postponed. But the 'men and boys' responded. The Stratford *Herald* reported that 'volunteers, to the number of fifteen to twenty appeared on the spot after their day's work...and, working with a will, enabled the task of levelling and enclosure to be completed'. In 2023, St Mary's still asks 'Help'. If you'd like to join a work party to cut ivy, clear gutters, and get ready for Christmas, come to the church on Saturday 2 **December, 10.00 - 1.00.** Bring your secateurs! 
