The Easter celebrations this year will be more open than last year and it is wonderful that our churches are able to hold face to face services. But even so there will be no singing yet, no wine of celebration to symbolise the outpouring of Jesus love for us, and no simple greeting one another over a cup of coffee.

How do we give thanks during a time of pandemic? The resurrection that we celebrate at Easter reminds us that death is not the end. The many celebrations that have not happened this year of birthdays, anniversaries, Church festivals and yes, people's lives, have left us with a great gap, a communal sense of bereavement and loss. Easter reminds us that all is conquered in Christ Jesus, that if we receive the gift he offers we can know in our hearts that the celebration of all that life gives us can never be taken away. Christ overcomes death *for us*, at Easter he opens for us the greatest possible celebration which not even a dreadful pandemic can deny us.

Gustave Martelet writes 'Those words 'for us' offer a response to an otherwise insoluble problem that, being insoluble, casts a dark shadow over all our knowledge of the world and of one another. How to love others if we do not know that they are eternal?'

This Easter may we be made new by Christ Jesus passing from death to life *for us* and let us know in our hearts the wonder of a joy of celebration that surpasses the best party we can ever offer here on earth.

Nature Notes April 2021 Crown of Thorns

The thorn plant that was used to make the "crown of thorns" which was placed upon the head of Jesus, is believed to be a plant called *Euphorbia milii* also called Christ Thorn. The common name refers to the thorny crown Jesus was forced to wear during his crucifixion, with the red bracts of the flowers representing his blood. Native to Madagascar, *Euphorbia milii* was brought to the Middle East before the time of Christ. The sprawling, branching, vinelike stems can attain lengths of more than two metres (seven feet), though potted plants are considerably smaller!! The thorns grow up the whole stem and are very pointed and sharp. They are very pliable so are easy to shape into a circle and intertwine. In the words of a popular hymn "the head that once was crowned with thorns, is crowned with glory now." May you all have a happy, healthy and peaceful Easter.

John E. Fryer, Church Organist at St. Mary's Ilmington 1972-1983

It is with great sadness that we announce the death of John Edward Fryer, who died peacefully on 2 November, at home in Downingtown, PA, USA at the age of 90, with family by his bedside. John lived with his late wife, Jeanne Fryer and their two daughters, Sarah, and Rachel, in Ilmington, where he was the church organist and choir master, from 1972-1983, before becoming organist at St. James' Chipping Campden, moving the family to Hidcote-Boyce, then to Stretton-on-Fosse. Born in Birmingham, John enjoyed a full, active, and varied life as a teacher, organist, and choir master, working in the UK, Uganda, and the USA. His final teaching job before retirement was with Jeanne at Kitebrook House Preparatory School, Gloucestershire. Sadly, Jeanne died shortly after retirement when the couple were living in Stretton-on-Fosse. Having met Kathy Kauterman while her choir toured the UK, John remarried and began a whole new chapter of his life based in Pennsylvania, regularly visiting the UK. His lively presence and quick wit will be much missed by all his friends and family who remain thankful for his life and so many happy memories.

Ilmington Parish Council News March 2021

It is six months since our last news and during that time the Parish Council (PC) have continued to meet via Zoom. Regrettably, this has meant that members without access to the means have not been present. However, the work of the Council has continued and we are pleased to report on that as follows:

Back St: After much dialogue, Warwickshire County Council sent in a team to cut through the root intrusions causing the outbreak of water from the manhole and flow down the road. They plan to replace the pipe at a later stage. WCC have also now agreed to remove the tree brash opposite Sansome House.

Playing Fields: A new flat roof covering has been installed at the Pavilion and Phase 2 of the renewal work to the Car Park has been completed. Repair and renewal of aspects of the Adventure Trail at the Playground are planned. Signage and notices will be installed shortly implementing a new approach to the use of the area by dog walkers. They are requested to use the "Mickleton" end and avoid the playground and sports surfaces.

Junction of Front St/ Armscote Rd: WCC have agreed to clear the under-road culvert (again), to reduce flooding and have been pressed by the PC to undertake resurfacing work of the area between Mickleton Rd and Armscote Rd. The PC are looking into the issue of easing the flow of the brook beyond this point. WCC has ordered a replacement for the bent direction sign at the junction.

Neighbourhood Plan: The Parish Council has been advised that Ilmington's NDP will be put to a Referendum on Thursday 6th May 2021. More information will be posted over the next months. Please vote!
