Mothering Sunday

Richard Cooke, Rector, writes:

Mothering Sunday is always the fourth Sunday in Lent, often known as 'Refreshment Sunday' when, just for a day, the Lenten Fast could be broken. It had the air of a holiday about it, so it was when families could get together and became a good opportunity to say thanks to Mothers, especially by going to church with them.

For us as a family it will be a strange day this year – Dylan, our 3½ year old grandson, died in late January. He was diagnosed with a genetic condition called Sandhoff disease when he was about 18 months old – so incredibly rare that he was the 33rd known live case in the world and one of only two currently in the UK. From about the age of 6 months he had lost functions rather than gained them, as his brain gradually ceased to send messages to the rest of his body. I'm very grateful to all those in the parishes who have helped and supported us over recent months as we have struggled with the situation. Just before Christmas we had a traumatic three weeks where Dylan was very ill and was not expected to live. Yet, remarkably, he recovered from the that crisis, and someone said to me: 'Do you think it is love that is keeping him alive?' In a practical sense, of course, it was true: without the devotion to Dylan's care that his Mum and Dad showed, his life would have ended earlier. But it was perhaps true in a deeper sense too, that their love sustained life far beyond what we might have expected. Though his awareness was very limited towards the end. I am sure that Dylan knew how loved he was, and still is.

You won't be surprised to know that I don't have an answer to 'Why do such things happen?' But I do know that through a very hard couple of years, I have had a deep sense that God has been in this with us, sharing the pain and suffering, giving strength and courage when we have needed it. Love, both given and received, is often costly, and the story of Jesus reflects that. On the cross, human pain strikes deep into the heart of God, and it helps to know that we are not alone.

I took Dylan's funeral on 8th February, and we came out of the chapel into a bright Spring morning – the same chapel where I had taken my Mother's funeral over 30 years ago. For me there was a sense of God's love surrounding us, as our Mother's love, the first experience of human love, surrounds us. I hope that that sense too can be part of our Mothering Sunday celebrations this year.

St Mary's Whitchurch reopens for worship on Mothering Sunday, 19 March, at 4.00pm and all are welcome to come to the Special Service with refreshments to follow that afternoon. St Mary's is not always easy to find, but is on the road between Wimpstone and Crimscote, behind some trees and close to the river! Do come and join us if you can do so! There will also be Mothering Sunday services at Stretton-on-Fosse (9.30am), Tredington (10.30am) and Ilmington (11am).

Notes from a Small Church in a Field

Visitors will see, hanging on the north wall of the chancel, Royal Arms. From the time of Henry VIII such Arms would have been displayed above chancel arches, displacing the medieval 'rood' or crucifix in an assertion of the post-Reformation . These Arms quarter ENGLAND & FRANCE (our rulers' claims to be also Kings of France was first made by Edward III); SCOTLAND (brought in by the Stuarts); and IRELAND (first introduced by James I). For decades they were thought to date from Hanoverian times. But when they were restored twenty years ago, a 'G' for 'George' was discovered to conceal a much older monograph, "X R", for XAROLVS REX'. Here, then, is an original Coat of Arms of the 'Martyr King', Charles I, which survived in our remote church throughout Commonwealth, an unusual and a rare survival.

From the May elections, residents wishing to vote at a polling station will be required to show an accepted form of photo ID before they are issued with a ballot paper. Dogs On Ilmington Playing Field: The Parish Council is pleased to announce improvements to the designated dog exercise area at Ilmington Playing Fields. New post and mesh fencing has been erected alongside the roadside boundary to deter our canine friends from escaping into the road. Villagers and visitors alike are welcome to use this area, located to the west of the tennis courts, i.e. the Mickleton end, to exercise their animals. A designated dog exercise area was created in response to concerns about dog fouling in places where children play. The public health risks of dog faeces left on the ground are well known. Dog walkers are cordially reminded to avoid taking their dogs onto the children's playground and football pitches. Dogs may be led on public footpaths or around the perimeter of the playing field to the designated dog exercise area. Please keep your dog on a lead until reaching the designated area and always pick up after your dog.
