The Revd Stephen Fletcher, Associate Minister, writes:

As I write this Jean and I are preparing for a trip away to join friends at the Taizé Christian community in France. This place and community has been a constant for us throughout our adult life and ministry. An early spiritual writer that has a place in the brothers' lives is St Augustine who wrote the words variously interpreted that the Christian life consists of a series of beginnings which never end.

This quote is not to say that history does not have a part to play. Having an eldest son who is a lecturer in military history we deeply value the place of history. Our time here in these Benefices has allowed us mutually to share a time of history and also to learn something of the history of the parishes we have tried to serve. We are immensely grateful to all those who have shared their journey with us through this time and supported us in our journey. However, in the salutary words of the Gospel: 'No one who puts his hand to the plough and keeps looking back is fit for the Kingdom of God'. So let us look to a new beginning and celebrate the generosity of spirit that allows us to welcome the future and to support one another in all that lies ahead. The future we entrust to God through faith and we are not to be victims of fear. My new parishes are in an area that is steeped in my own family history but has changed immensely over the last 60 years since my family was actively involved. Our background has a place to play and may form who we are, but we are also about new beginnings. During my time here we marked the death of my dear Mother who would be amazed at living to the same age as our late Queen and having the same cause of death: 'old age'. This, for the Christian, is the ultimate in new beginnings.

Let us always welcome new beginnings and seek to show confidence in those entrusted with walking with us into our future. We are always strengthened by the traditions that have given confidence to past generations. Stephen

Nature Notes November 2022

The UK is home to two types of seals the grey seal and the common/harbour seal. Seal pups can mostly be seen from November to January. There are a number of places to see seals with their pups, however it is vital to respect them keeping your distance to avoid distress. Seal pups feed on very rich milk tripling their birth weight in about 3 weeks. At that time they form small groups called weaner pods remaining on land whilst their mothers go to sea to feed. After a week or two the pups take their first swim in the sea. Seal pups are at their most vulnerable when starting to explore their environment, due to discarded plastic pollution and fishing nets. A seal pup will play with and eat plastic not realising the danger. Psalm 24:1 says "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it". We are called to be good
