Harvest Time

Under a full moon during the hot weather in mid-August, on most nights in the village, tractors trundled through till the early hours of the morning pulling trailers full of the harvest. We moved into the Rectory in March, when the fields were just showing the first shoots. Day by day, as we walked the dog, we could see them grow until, in July, so many of the hills were covered by a waving blond crop. Now the fields are covered in a golden stubble as the shadows lengthen earlier in the evenings, and the weather begins to turn towards Autumn.

We celebrate Harvest Festival in late September or early October once 'All is safely gathered in' as a farmer once said to me, quoting the hymn, and not before. Harvest Thanksgiving to mark the end of the harvest was once balanced by the 'Lammas' celebration at the beginning in early August. Lammas was short for 'loaf-mas', a festival which centred on the offering of the first bread made from the newly harvested wheat in Church. In a more agriculturally-based society than ours has become, the months of August and September were hard work as whole villages turned out to help, and then celebration once the harvest had safely arrived, in the form both of Church worship and a community feast, the Harvest Supper. Though there are many things that might worry us about the cost of living today, reflecting on how many good things we have and how comparatively well off we are in this country is a good thing to pause and do from time to time. Harvest Festival is a great opportunity to put aside worry in favour of thanksgiving, if only for a little while and to celebrate both in worship and song in church and in a festival meal, either with others or with the family, rather like the American 'Thanksgiving' meal.

At the same time our Harvest Festivals might also encourage us to think of other harvests, further from home, in rural areas in Africa, for example. I'm fortunate enough to have visited churches in Uganda and Nigeria in the past and seen at first hand a very different scale of life from ours. In those places, living closer to the edge than we do results in a real sense of thanksgiving when the harvest is safely gathered. As part of our Harvest Festivals we'll be seeking to support the charity 'Ripple Effect', which was until recently known as 'Send a Cow'. One of the ways Ripple Effect works is by twinning gardens in this country with some in Kenya – a great idea, especially for children. (See https://rippleeffect.org/ for more information.) Supporting them is one way of sharing our harvest with the wider world.

Nature Notes- September 2022

September heralds the start of a new season – Autumn and with it a change in the weather, our surroundings, the trees and the plants as God's creation starts to prepare for winter. Our trees put on a spectacular display of stunning colours yellow turning to reds and golds, our mammals and birds prepare to have a feast on the berries and seeds produced. Have you ever looked closely at a leaf? They have an amazing structure. You can see a main vein (midrib) and smaller veins attached to the midrib. These veins were designed to carry water, minerals and food to the main stem. Leaves are arranged on the stem in a specific way. This is to enable the leaf to absorb the maximum amount of sunlight for that tree or plant. There are other parts to the leaf that allow the exchange of oxygen and carbon dioxide. So, as we can see the leaf plays a very important part in the health of the tree or plant. God thought of everything!
