### A Good World?

The beginning of the Book of Genesis doesn't get a very good press these days – the story of a six-day creation, which someone in the 17<sup>th</sup> Century calculated must have begun on 23 October, 4004 BC (at 9am, to be precise!) is frequently dismissed as having been disproved long ago; not least because we know that the earth is much, much, older than that.

In fact it's only really in the more modern era that people began to take the story of the creation of the world in Genesis literally in this way. Go back to the early Christian centuries and you find that there was widespread recognition that the creation stories in Genesis were imaginative meditations. In a world that people experienced as full of change and chance, as we still do, the opening of Genesis makes an affirmation of faith that the world is good, even if occasionally the evidence seems to point in another direction. After each action of creation comes the refrain, 'And God saw that it was good.' There is a theory that in the early pages of the Bible what we actually have is a script for an ancient act of worship, and that the people would join in this refrain, repeating again and again, 'And God saw that it was good.'

It takes faith to believe that the world is good, sometimes, but the Harvest season which we celebrate in late September and early October in our churches is a time for reaffirming that belief and giving thanks for all the good things we receive. The act of planting seeds is itself an act of faith in a good world, that the seeds will grow and a harvest will result. The ancient focus is on the harvest of the land, of course, but it's actually a good opportunity to reflect on all the good things, both material and non-material, that we have received. It's out of that sense of thankfulness that generosity can grow, again, both materially and non-materially: we rightly speak of generosity of heart as well as generosity with money.

The Book of Genesis takes this a step further and invites us to see that this is how God sees the world, too. For all its shortcomings at times, the world is fundamentally good, and it is pretty much a straight line from that thought to the way John's Gospel describes that 'God so loved the world that he gave his only son' for it (John 3.16).

This Harvest I hope we can both give thanks, joining in the ancient tradition, and also be generous in our response to the good world that surrounds us.

Remembrance Sunday falls on 12 November this year, and will be marked in each of the churches in the group by a service starting at 10.50am.

### Nature Notes October 2023

Spiders build webs all year round, but we notice them more in the Autumn, because they tend to be out looking for a mate, making them more visible. A spider's web is like the wheel of a bike, the "spokes" aren't sticky, while the strands that circle the spokes are. Four spiders make this type of web in about two hours starting by drifting a silk line across a gap and adding supporting threads. The web traps the spider's prey. King David was saved by a spider's web when on the run from his enemies. David hid in a cave with his enemies closing in. Who came to the rescue? God sent a spider to build a web across the entrance to the cave. His enemies didn't bother to check the cave because they took the spider's web as a sign that no one had entered it. *Gill*

### Notes from a Small Church in a Field

In the medieval church, stained glass windows were considered 'poor people's Bibles'. The illiterate could read in the windows stories from the Old Testament -- Noah's ark, Cain and Abel, Abraham and Isaac -- that were frequently, in the great churches, set in parallel with episodes that they foreshadowed in the life of Christ. In our church, in the lower tracery lights of the east window, we can see glass that represents the four gospel writers: an angel for Matthew, Mark's winged lion, the ox for Luke and John's eagle. But then above them, in the top tracery, in the extreme left and right lights, we can see something comical. A face with a tongue sticking out. Are these green men, also called woodwoses? If so, they're part folklore story-telling that has been around for a long time. They symbolise seasonal renewal -- perhaps an apt image for ecological awareness today. *Carol Rutter, Churchwarden*
