Wedding Bells!

We have over 20 weddings booked across our six churches this year. This is partly because there's a bit of a backlog after the gap caused by the Pandemic over the last two years, but I think there's a bit more to it than that. In some cases those getting married have been together guite long time already, and say that they have just 'got round to' getting married. Others feel that making a public commitment has become important to them after the events of the recent past in a way that hadn't seemed to matter quite so much before. People tend to know each other much better now, and to get married later in the relationship than they used to, and this seems a good thing. One couple whose wedding I took recently gave me a great quotation from the psychotherapist Philippa Perry. She said that what makes somebody right for someone else is commitment, being together like 'two stones rubbing together until suddenly they fit', because 'You like or love someone when you like or love yourself when you're with them — and that takes a long time to know. You have to let them in.' Some people are a bit anxious about the 'God bit'. Though a marriage in Church has, for obvious and also legal reasons, to have a Christian frame of reference, it doesn't have to be heavily so. And I find Church weddings are becoming delightfully creative, with all sorts of music being used, for example. It's a real privilege to work with couples to craft the service which they want, which expresses their personalities, and involves others who are special to them.

A few years ago the Church of England brought in the idea of 'qualifying connection' – which means that you can get married in a variety of churches, not just the one nearest to where you live. The Church is also getting better at recognising that second marriages, too, may be an important opportunity to put the past behind us, and celebrate a new start after heartbreak and difficulty. So if you're thinking of getting married, or know someone who is, why not get in touch?

Neighbourhood Plan: The Story So Far June 2022

The Submission Version of the Neighbourhood Plan can be viewed at: https://



TredingtonNP.co.uk . The Basic Conditions Statement and the Consultation document are also viewable on the web site. These documents will form the submission of the Neighbourhood Plan to the District Council who will then carry out their own consultation and submit it to a planning inspector for review. Once the stages are complete the Plan will be put to a referendum of all Parish residents who will vote for or against it. Whether the Plan is adopted will depend on the outcome of the referendum.

Ormond Lodge: The District Council has recently approved a planning application for a block of five small dwellings in the grounds of Ormond Lodge, which will contribute to the housing stock in Newbold. The decision will result in a slight change to Newbold's Built Up Area Boundary to accommodate these dwellings. Development of this area has been supported throughout the Neighbourhood Plan process.

Stratford District Council's Revised Site Allocation Plan: The revision to the Site Allocations Plan has recently been approved by the District Council. The two Reserve Housing Sites in Newbold (Ormond Lodge and the field behind the village hall) have been removed. The District Council judged that Newbold had exceeded the allotted number of houses in the Core Strategy by a considerable margin and no further sites were required in the village. However, the Reserve Housing Site on the Blackwell Road in Tredington remains, Armscote, Blackwell, Darlingscott, Newbold on Stour, Tredington. www.tredingtonparishcouncil.co.uk; www.TredingtonNP.co.uk


