

Coronation Time!

Less than a year ago we were remembering back to 1953, before many of us were born, to the Queen's Coronation we celebrated the Jubilee. On 6 May we shall see King Charles crowned in Westminster Abbey and perhaps reflect on how the country has changed in the intervening 70 years.



The service of Coronation is very ancient, in essence going back to 978, over a thousand years. It is full of Christian symbolism but at its heart it is not about the pomp and pageantry, but the humble offering of an individual to rule in the service of the people and for their good, under God. There is something deeply poignant about this, a reminder that in the end the King is only a man, who cannot ever be fully ready for the task ahead – even if he has had longer to prepare for it than anyone else in history!

Charles has also had his life picked over and lived in the spotlight perhaps more than any other individual in history. Though the King no longer wields any direct power, he has influence in many ways in how he leads, what he advises, and in the values he champions. So he deserves our prayers as he prepares for the coronation, and we shall be praying for him especially on Sunday 30 April at our regular services at Preston-on-Stour (9.30am), Tredington (10.30am and Ilmington (11.00am). In the meantime here is one of the official prayers, which you might like to use:

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, bless our Sovereign Lord, King Charles, and all who are in authority under him; that they may order all things in wisdom and equity, righteousness and peace, to the honour of your name, and the good of your Church and people; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

As the year progresses, we will see other varieties that call these places home. God has given us such a rich variety of beautiful wild flowers with different colours, shapes and sizes for our enjoyment. Why not use part of your garden or encourage our local churches to use a small part of their churchyards to increase biodiversity by sowing some wildflower seeds.
