## To Rule or to Lead?

After Boris Johnson gave his resignation to the Queen at Balmoral in early September, there was a brief period when there was no Prime Minister. Liz Truss's plane was delayed at Aberdeen airport, preventing her from receiving the invitation to form a new government. During that time Queen Elizabeth was briefly in charge, with her powers delegated to nobody. Nothing happened in that 40 minutes, but it is remarkable that at 96, and only a couple of days before her death, the Queen remained more than capable of ruling. She didn't take the opportunity to make any changes and duly handed over to the new Premier (though someone I spoke to not long after said they bet that the Queen had a few good ideas she might have liked to try...).

British Queens and Kings don't really rule any more. The last to try to do so was George III back in the late 18th Century. For 250 years royal powers have been delegated to Government ministers, and policy and politics decided democratically. Yet though our monarchs may not rule, they do still lead, as we saw dramatically again during the Pandemic. For then it was the Queen's messages that helped to hold us together – encouraging us to remember that 'We'll meet again' for example, and the Queen's actions as she handled the death of Prince Philip in such a dignified way. She was following in the footsteps of her parents during the Second World War, as they refused to leave London even at the height of the Blitz. These examples show how direct power is often over-estimated. In ceasing to rule in any obvious way, the British Monarchy has gained in its capacity to lead. Queen Elizabeth's character, her obvious dedication to service of others, her integrity and the humour she showed in not seeming to take herself too seriously (seen in her Jubilee cup of tea with Paddington Bear), have offered leadership not by ruling directly but by showing us how to be good human beings.

It's a hard act for King Charles to follow, though his accession speech showed clearly that he knows what it is to lead rather than rule, and in his energetic early travels round the UK he made a point of mentioning that as Prince of Wales for over 50 years his motto has been 'Ich dien' – I serve – not 'I rule'. For the pattern of servant leadership to follow, as the Queen herself often reminded us in her Christmas broadcasts, is the pattern of Jesus Christ, the King who never ruled from a throne and yet whose influence on human history is incalculably greater than anyone who ever has. His example of leadership by humility and service, sacrifice and love is the one that the Coronation Service will emphasise next year, when King Charles is crowned. In our own spheres of life there is much for us to learn from this contrast between rule and leadership. Perhaps the greatest gift our Queen has left us, and her successor, is that in the end it's not so much what you do or achieve that matters, but who you are and how you act – the person you are in relationship with others. That is what others remember, and is the legacy we leave above all.

# Nature Notes-October 2022

Autumn is a time of preparation for mammals fattening themselves up on seed, nuts and berries. Squirrels, voles and mice sote food for winter when it is scarce. How can we help our precious wildlife? By creating a home for wildlife in our gardens. In helping them, they will help us in Spring/Summer in our gardens. Let's think about creating some wildlife habitats in our garden for winter. No matter how large/small our garden is we can do something.

A small pile of logs ideal for minibeasts, wood mice, hedgehogs etc A small pile of rock/stones ideal for minibreasts, slow worms, frogs, toads A small pile of grass clippings, straw, leaves ideal for wood mice, shrews and minibeasts

A sheet of corrugated iron ideal for reptiles, amphibians, wood mice, voles A compost heap providing additional winter habitats

## Notes from a Small Church in a Field.

In about 1646 Sir William Dugdale visited St Mary's and saw a church very little changed since medieval times. Only a few years later, however, the church had been severely damaged, most likely by Oliver Cromwell's soldiers stationed in the district to block the road to Oxford at Talton. It was probably then that stained glass in the east window, described as 'unusually rich for a small country church', was smashed and stone canopies on either side of the window, mutilated. Only small pieces of medieval glazing survive in this window, in two faces of 'wodewose' or 'greenmen'. But in the south chancel window, the upper lights can be seen to have been patched together from fragments of medieval glass showing coats of arms that bear witness to the original Lords of Whitchurch Manor: Montforts, Belknaps, and Staffords. Our glass, then, remembers family histories -- but also an older history that belongs to folklore.




