### Looking Under the Bonnet?

'I didn't know what was wrong, only that the noise sounded expensive!' said a friend of mine when his car broke down. Most of us have little clue what happens under the bonnet of our cars, and we mostly ignore the mechanics of driving. We rely on others to know what goes on there and to get the car back on the road for us. And sometimes we're rather surprised at how much it costs for them to do so!

I sometimes wonder whether the church is a bit the same. Vicars asking for money used to be a staple part of British TV comedy, so I hesitate to bring the subject up, but it is important from time to time to be open about how our local churches are financed. To look under the bonnet, so to speak.

Barbara, my wife, recently sat on the train next to someone who had worked for the National Trust. Barbara mentioned that I was in charge of a group of ancient parish churches and they swapped stories about caring for historic buildings. 'So how much is the grant each church gets for the upkeep of its building every year?' asked her fellow-passenger. When she said that there was no grant, he was astonished.

In fact it is each church that is independently responsible for its own upkeep, insurance and other costs. These include a contribution to the 'Parish Share' which pays for clergy. For some time in our 'Downs and Valley Churches' group the costs have outstripped income, and the Pandemic had a very harsh effect on income. Gradually the gap between costs and income has widened and it is time for us to try to do something about this, before it is too late.

'But hang on!' I can hear you say, 'surely the Church of England is a very rich institution?' While it is true that the Church as a whole does sit on a great many valuable assets, the financial calculation of these will usually include many historic buildings which can't be sold (St Paul's Cathedral, anyone?!), and parcels of land which yield some income but can only be sold once. There was once a system of 'tithes', where either a tenth of produce, or later their monetary equivalent, was contributed by landowners to the local church, but that system became increasingly problematic and was finally brought to an end in the 1930s, since when there has been no state aid for the Church of England. All the funding for the local churches, both the buildings and clergy, comes from the local level.

I'll be writing a bit more about this in the Autumn, introducing some practical ways you can support your local church if you'd like to do so. In the meantime, there are Bank Account details elsewhere in the magazine which means that you can contribute, if you would like to - even small amounts are welcome. As someone used to say 'If you have been, thanks for listening', and looking briefly under the bonnet with me.

The Tredington Parish Neighbourhood Plan was officially 'made' at the District Council meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> July. Thank you to all who took the trouble to go out and vote. Turnout was 20%, quite high for a Neighbourhood Plan referendum. 246 voted 'yes' 31 voted 'no'. The steering group has several



people at Stratford District Council to thank for their guidance and support, particularly Rachel Blanchard and Louisa Slator.

We would also like to thank our Planning Consultants Neil and Jan at Avon Planning Services and, last but certainly not least, Locality: a public body, sponsored by Government, that provides financial support for communities wishing to create a Neighbourhood Plan. Without the substantial financial

and technical backing of Locality, and their funding of the site assessors Aecom, we could not have even started.

We hope there are no 'slaves' in the Parish as there were in 1086 as defined in the Domesday Book. Nearly 1,000 years

later we have tried to tell the story of the Parish. Among other things, we hope the plan will provide a detailed guide to any developer seeking to build in the Parish.

Each day we read the same passage twice and come expectant that God will speak through it. 24-7started in 1999, when a simple, student-led prayer vigil suddenly went viral. Today 24-7 is an international interdenominational movement of prayer, mission and justice, a non-stop Christian prayer meeting that has continued for every minute of this century so far, in over half the countries on Earth.

### Notes from a Small Church in a Field

It's sometimes supposed, since infant mortality was so common, that parents in the past didn't notice the death of children. Not so. In the 17th century Ben Jonson, praying his lost son would 'rest in soft peace', called him his 'best piece of poetry'. William Shakespeare, after his boy Hamnet died, wrote a whole play that imagined lost children miraculously restored to life. Later churchyard history tells the same story. In our churchvard, infants weren't usually memorialised with marked graves -- but it's clear their lives were remembered. When Elizabeth Compton died aged 80 in 1860, her headstone remembered 'two children who died young', perhaps sixty years earlier. The headstone of John and Rynah Taylor, who died within a year of each other, recorded their son Benjamin, dead twenty-five years before. Burying their daughter Miriam in 1903, the Horsemans inscribed her headstone also with her 10-month-old brother's name, deceased 1888. These lives may have been brief. But they weren't forgotten.
