#### Richard Cooke, Rector, writes:

Some changes are afoot with the Six Parishes Magazine, as we seek to expand it and develop it. Although at heart it is the Magazine of the six churches of Preston-on-Stour, Whitchurch, Ilmington, Tredington, Darlingscott and Stretton-on-Fosse, it's also a valuable resource for the wider village communities and I was really pleased, when I arrived in the parishes a year ago, to see how well-used and appreciated it is. I'm very grateful to Susan Brock, who edits the magazine, and Tim Seller, who looks after the finances. There will be room for more news from the villages and more advertising in the new format, so do get in touch if you'd like to have some space.

One of the things to look out for in the new format is a change of name. As one or two people have pointed out, 'Six Parishes' isn't quite accurate! There are actually five ecclesiastical parishes, relating to the six churches I listed above, because Tredington and Darlingscott are a single parish with two church buildings. Until Atherstone church was closed some decades ago, Atherstone would have been the sixth parish but it's now amalgamated with Preston. And while we're checking the names, you'll see that, strictly speaking, Stretton-on-Fosse is linked with Ditchford, but there has been no church at Ditchford since the 17th Century! All in all, it seemed best to go with a new name for the magazine!

During the Pandemic 'The Fosseway Six' was proposed for the parishes, but it doesn't really seem to have caught on, so we're going with the 'Downs and Valley Churches' instead. Ilmington and Crimscote Downs, and the Stour Valley, are the features of the landscape that unite all of the villages. (If you're not sure why hills are called 'Downs' - surely they're 'ups'?! - the answer is that it comes from the same Anglo-Saxon word as 'dunes' — a small hill.) Anyway, we hope you like the new Magazine when it comes, and will be grateful for any feedback you'd like to pass on!

#### **Nature Notes February 2023**

There is a plant called dicentra spectabilis or bleeding heart (although these days its name is lamprocapnos), and a variety called Valentine. It is native to Siberia, Northern China, Japan and Korea. This is a delicate plant with arching stems and beautiful heart shaped flowers of pink with a white droplet. There are other colours as well. It is shade loving and can be seen growing in rock crevices at low altitudes in the mountains. However, we don't have to go abroad to see it as it was introduced to the UK in 1810, then lost but reintroduced in 1846 by a Scottish botanist. It has been my pleasure to

have one in the garden! I thank God for the wonderful diversity of plants and the pleasure they give us and in celebrating Valentine's Day as some of us might do we can also celebrate God's love for us freely given we just have to receive it.

#### Notes from a Small Church in a Field

This continues our series of extracts from Ursula Bloom's memoire, *The Changed Village* (1945). She writes that village weddings 'were gay. We used to make the bouquets out of flowers from our garden and the village would be full of excitement.' She'd get 'confetti ready to throw at the lucky pair in the churchyard', and afterwards there was 'the enormous feed' that the villagers 'had been preparing all week. Tremendous spreads were produced. There was something of almost everything, and toasts to be drunk, and speeches to be made with the usual rather stereotyped jokes. I remember one bride taking me up to her room where, quite brazenly, her nightdress was reposing beside his pyjamas, and pyjamas then were an innovation. I cannot help thinking that these were only for show, for the men always slept in their shirts.'
