

'Talkative little Christianity'?

Lent begins on Wednesday 5 March, and of course it's often a time when people give something up for the forty days or so that take us to the great festival of Easter. Giving things up for a while has become quite fashionable recently – think of 'dry January' for instance. The motive is really the same as it was originally for Lent: to learn to control our appetites and desires so that they do not (at best) distract or (at worst) control us. At heart it's about learning to be disciplined and to live simpler, perhaps less cluttered lives, a stripping back of the self to the essentials.

I find that many people have that kind of yearning, and express it through all sorts of activities, such as yoga or tai chi, or mindfulness. These kinds of disciplines are often derived from eastern religions and I know many people find them helpful. I'm glad that they do, but also just a little sad that some of the riches of the Christian tradition can get overlooked. I can understand why. In the novel A Passage to India, EM Forster has one of his characters speak about 'talkative little Christianity', and that phrase sums up well how the Christian faith has often been practised, with too many words making faith complicated. Yet there is also a deep tradition running back to earliest Christian times that values stillness and silence in the face of God, and encourages us to set aside the busy, talkativeness of daily life and to pray, if only for a few minutes.

But prayer too often also gets caught up in a sea of words, and Christian prayer can too easily become a 'shopping list' of things we would like to see changed in the world. The Christian contemplative tradition begins with silence and stillness, becoming aware of the presence of God around us and beside us. It's about stopping and paying attention to the present and is often without words, though some people find it helpful to repeat a single, simple phrase such as the Eastern Orthodox 'Jesus Prayer': 'Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner' in the stillness.

The Church of England especially has not come well out of the last few months, and perhaps a time of silence might be the best response for a while. I hope it would not be an empty silence, though, because I have a feeling that in the silence there might be a deeper awareness of the presence of God. If you think of giving up something for Lent, why not try giving up words for a few minutes each day? And sit, quietly, with open hands, and perhaps becoming aware of the presence of God that is beyond words.

Notes from a Small Church in the Field: Our Missing Minister (con't)

Apparently, Thomas Marriott's threats against 'Mr Winter' didn't prevail and the puritan-leaning Winter entered into the incumbency of St Mary's Whitchurch in 1650. For awhile peace reigned. But Winter might have wished himself elsewhere, for in 1653 the south wall of the nave of the church collapsed. Nothing was done about this for several years. Services continued in the Chancel. We can only imagine how the faithful carried on. Meanwhile several farmers, 'Samuel Winter clerk and John Underhill gent. of Whitchurch' were presented at Warwick Quarter Sessions for selling ale without a licence. Not very puritan, you might say. They were fined and 'the rest discharged in Trinity sessions 1654 upon their traverse'. In other words, 'do not come before us again'. Within a few years, though, St Mary's would face even more devastation — this time, from a storm. Robert Howe (with CCR)

<u>Changes to Metering, Heating and Key Access</u> <u>at the Village Hall</u>

The old coin meters have been replaced with a single meter using online payments. Just scan to QR code and select the amount you wish to pay directly from your smart phone. Both the meter control and the main hall heating switching are now located outside of the electrical equipment cupboard to make them easier and safer to use. We have also installed additional heating to the main hall in the form of a high powered air curtain. The additional heating can be controlled locally and is intended to provide a guick warm up at the commencement of any hiring and until occupants are comfortable just using the main heating system. To improve security at the village hall, we have changed the key safe located at the main entrance. At the time of hiring a unique code will be issued which can be keyed in or transferred via blue tooth and the key safe app. Regular users will continue to be allocated a key and a key will be held at the shop for emergency use. 
