The Platinum Jubilee

Over the extended weekend of 2-5 June we shall be celebrating the Platinum Jubilee of the Queen. It's an extraordinary thing for one individual to celebrate 70 years of doing anything, let alone being a monarch. To put it into perspective, the longest recorded reign of a monarch is that of Louis XIV, the 'Sun King' of France (1643-1715). He completed 72 years, but was only 4 years old when he became King. King Bhumibol of Thailand reigned for just over 70 years (1946-2016), starting when he was 19, but the Queen will shortly overtake him. She long ago outstripped her great-grandmother Victoria's 63 years on the throne.

But I doubt that Her Majesty is counting the years and days with an eye to her own place in the record books. Despite some recent mobility problems, and the death of Prince Philip last year, the latest pictures of her show someone still dedicated without question to the role which she took on as a very young woman in 1952. She has always taken her duty to the country seriously, and one of the things that shines through her life most clearly is how she sees herself as a servant of her people, and how the needs of the country come first. It's a very distinctive vision of what it means to rule, and reflects directly the words of the Coronation service, which underlined the importance of upholding justice and mercy, of protecting the weak and caring for those who have no-one to care for them. It is a Christian vision of leadership that does not take what it can get from being in power, but uses power responsibly for the good of all, accountable to God.

Just before the Queen was enthroned, there was a pause in the Coronation service and the Archbishop of Canterbury prayed a prayer of blessing upon her:

The Lord bless you and keep you.

The Lord protect you in all your ways

and prosper all your handywork...

May Wisdom and Knowledge be the Stability of your Times,

and the fear of the Lord your Treasure. Amen.

It is a prayer that has been more than answered these 70 years past.

Nature Notes June 2022

Last year I had the delight of seeing an amazing variety of butterflies on a Buddleia bush spending happy moments taking photos. What a wonderful sight to see! Butterflies are some of the most beautiful insect visitors to our gardens. We have around 60 butterfly species, up to 22 of these can be recorded in gardens. Butterflies have four different life stages undergoing a complete change, or metamorphosis beginning life as an egg, hatching into a caterpillar, pupating into a chrysalis, finally emerging as an adult. Butterflies need warmth to be active and fly, and nectar to drink for energy. Planting plenty of different nectar plants that flower throughout spring, summer and autumn, in a sheltered, sunny spot should bring the reward of seeing these beautiful butterflies in our gardens. I am reminded that just as butterflies change into something very beautiful so God can change us too to be more like Him, changing us from the inside out if we will let Him.

WHITCHURCH

Notes from a Small Church in a Field

Bells in medieval English churches didn't just 'make a joyful noise unto the Lord'. They organised parochial and domestic life around the canonical hours. At the Reformation, when the uses of the 'old faith' were suppressed (along with the monasteries), many of these bells were removed. (Some of them wound up in Venice, where you can still hear them today.) Originally, three bells hung in the little bell tower of St Mary's. Today, only one bell remains – one of the oldest bells in Warwickshire. It is similar to bells at Beaudesert that are dated circa 1350. Since both manors were owned by the de Montforts from the late 12th century, it is likely that the Whitchurch bell belongs to the same date. An inscription, only letters, reads *J. N. R. J. A. M. A. G. A.* for Jesus Nazarenus Rex Judaeorum Ave Maria Gratia. This bell is the only portion of the pre-Reformation furniture of the church that survives.

We're going to hold an open session at St. Mary's Church, Preston, for anyone who would like to try their hand at bellringing. Ringing is for men and women - all are welcome. Since the end of the Second World War (during which, of course, church bells were silent, only to be rung in the event of invasion), Preston's historic bells* have been kept swinging by generations of ringers, some ringing regularly and some only occasionally - it's up to individuals to choose.
