# Holidays – time for a rest?

It's funny how you don't remember the rainy days, isn't it? Most of us can recall the sense of freedom that came with the end of the Summer term – no matter how much we enjoyed school – and all those carefree weeks when routine vanished and, in the memory at least, every day of the holidays was sunny.

Holidays this year are eagerly anticipated after the difficulties of the Pandemic and all that has come from it. But it can be pretty stressful going away, particularly if you're heading abroad given the uncertainties about air travel at the moment, or even at home as rail strikes take place. But let's assume you get away without too much trouble and have arrived at your destination. What do you do now?

For many of us in 21<sup>st</sup> Century Western culture, 'switching off' is hard to do. Smart phones keep you connected with home and often with work, and probably there is a myriad of things going around in your head, and disentangling those can take a good few days. One of the distinctive elements of our culture is the way we find it hard to set our concerns aside, to really take some time away from the normal routine, and perhaps recapture some of that 'end of term' feeling we once had. In other words, to rest.

The Bible starts with the story of creation, and portrays God making the heavens and the earth and then, seeing what has been made is good, resting, satisfied with the work he's done. It's a powerful image of stillness and enjoyment, of being able to rest and take a holiday and let the world tick along on its own. It's from that ancient Jewish story that the idea of sabbath – which means in Hebrew simply a rest from labour – developed, and in time the idea of holiday, which of course meant originally a 'holy day'.

So if holidays are really about rest, what do we do? Well, intentionally turning off phones, moving email apps from the front screen (or temporarily disabling them) can help, for example. The Out of Office message is a useful tool. Being clear with yourself, as much as anyone else, that it's OK to take some time away and disengage is important too. Allowing for a bit of decompression time at the start of the holiday matters as well – I find it usually takes two or three days to get there for me, and having worked that out helps those around me!

I'm far from an expert in this, I hasten to add, but making rest a priority on holiday can make a big difference. It helps us to refocus, to see what we return to a bit differently, very often, and brings new perspective. It helps us become more aware of the world around us, and stops us from being too centred on ourselves and our needs. If it does that, then I'd say that it brings us closer to God too.

# Notes from a Small Church in a Field.

Who was William Smyth? His remains lie in a handsome chest tomb on the north side of the chancel, its marble slab incised with a cross, chalice, and book. The inscription running around the border reads in translation 'Here lies William Smyth sometime Rector of this church to whose soul may God be gracious. He died on the feast of St Maurice in the year of our Lord 1442 Jesu Mercy.' Smyth may have been a young schoolmaster – in Worcester at the turn of the century. He was clerk to the Botiler family 'heirs...[of] the church at Whitcherche' in the reign of Henry IV. His master, William Botiler, served under Henry V at Agincourt, 1415. When the incumbency fell vacant in 1420, Botiler's widow appointed Smyth rector of Whitchurch. Graffiti on the tomb is suggestive. In the absence of schoolrooms, churches were used for teaching. Can we imagine generations of schoolboys, set to learn Latin verbs, sitting on 'scole magistro' Smyth's tomb, idly carving their initials into the marble instead? And what about the outline of the foot that appears there? It's not graffiti. It's the mark of 'stewardship'.
