Richard Cooke, Rector, writes:

Amazing Grace!

1st January 2023 sees the 250th anniversary of composition of the well-known hymn 'Amazing Grace'. At Darlingscott Church on 1st January 2023 at 11.00am we shall have special service to mark the anniversary. What is not so well known about Amazing Grace is that it seems to have been composed in Warwickshire, just up the road from our villages, in nearby Kineton. John Newton, the author, was at the time the curate of the parish of Olney in Buckinghamshire. But he was an unusual clergyman for the time, having gone to sea at 11 and been press-ganged into the Navy at the age of 17. Most of Newton's subsequent sea-going career was spent in the slave trade, eventually as captain of a series of slave-ships. As a young man he was himself enslaved for three years in West Africa. Soon after this, utterly dejected and suicidal, he began to read his Bible and eventually came to know the presence of God at his darkest times. Though it was a long process, by the early 1750s Newton had become a Christian. Ill-health forced him to give up his life as a sailor, He had begun preaching and pursued a call to ordination. It was 9 years before he found a bishop 8who would ordain an old sea-captain, but in 1764 he became minister of Olney.

In time he began to reflect on his life, and, remarkably for the 18th Century, he began to see the evils of the slave-trade which he had continued to invest in, even once he left the sea. His own period of enslavement gave him some insight into and sympathy with the slaves whom he had transported from Africa. He was aware, too, that the trade had become increasingly brutal and profit-driven, and in what amounted to a second conversion he eventually came out in opposition to the slave trade. In 1788 he published a Confession, 'that I was once an active instrument in a business at which my heart now shudders.' This was an important moment in the growing campaign against the slave trade, and Newton's voice was a powerful one.

This life-story lies behind his most famous hymn. At Olney Newton would write a hymn for his evening service once a week, and for 1st January 2023 the Bible text he was preaching from was 'Who am I, that thou hast brought me thus far?' It prompted 'Amazing Grace', and people have been singing it ever since. One estimate is that is performed about 10 million times a year.

And the Kineton connection? Well, Newton went to stay with his friend William Taylor, vicar of Kineton, after Christmas 1772. He returned to Olney for New Year's Eve, so it seems that it was while at Kineton that his famous hymn was born.

Nature Notes December 2023

I love to hear the "chattering" of house sparrows in hedges where they like to congregate together. This little bird may not be as colourful as some we have, but nonetheless is just as attractive. However, once common in the UK this little bird is now on the red list of concern. Habitat destruction, house building with small gardens/virtually no garden where species cannot survive all cause the decline. They enjoy eating grains, nuts and scraps and will happily come to a bird table if you put food out. Nests are often in holes, crevices, thick hedges/conifers and nest boxes. A hole is filled with dry grass/straw and lined with feathers, hairs, string and paper. Pairs often remain faithful to their nest site and to each other for life. There is a song about God's care of the sparrow and us which says For His eye, His eye is on the sparrow, And I know, I know He watches over me. Now that's something to be thankful for!

Many of you will be aware of this Charity, but for the benefit of those that aren't, small annual payments are currently issued under the following categories, depending on available funds:

Winter Fuel Payment' – an annual payment is made in December to anyone over 65, who have been resident in the Parish for 3 years or more. **Also**, to households with at least one pre-school aged child.

'Moving to secondary school' – a one off payment made in July to all children moving from year 6 to year 7 to help with costs such as uniform.

'Moving to second year of University Education' – a one off payment made to those who have completed their first year at university and plan to continue onto a second year.

'Hardship Payment' – 'for the relief of distress and sickness' by personal application to the trustees or brought to the attention of the trustees.

'Individual Educational Grants' – on personal application to the trustees.

'Community Organisations' – considered on application for projects that will benefit the community of Stretton Parish.

Notes from a Small Church in a Field

This continues our series of extracts from Ursula Bloom's memoire, *The Changed Village* published in 1945. She writes of Christmas at the rectory at the turn of the last century that it was 'a real old beano': 'On Christmas Eve down we all trailed to decorate the church, attacking laurels, yews, holly and box and dragging them along with us. The Hall supplied flowers for the altar. It was dark before we got back (by lantern light). At six, Christmas began, and we decorated the house. Carollers arrived in solemn rotation. Sometimes opposing village choirs met at the gate and had a free fight there, and once a poor old woman came entirely alone and sang *The First Noel*, and only after my uncle had given her sixpence did he find that she was my mother dressed up as a tramp.'


