SCHEDULE

All exhibits to be staged between **8.00am** and **10.00am** on the morning of the Show and removed between **4.30pm** and **5.00pm**.

Note: Names of varieties of flowers, fruit and vegetables would be welcome, if known. All exhibits in Section A must be grown in the exhibitor's own garden or allotment. Criteria for judging for each class may be found on the Ilmington 20:20 Vision website at <https://www.ilmington2020vision.co.uk/hortsoc>

SECTION A: VEGETABLES AND FRUIT

(No garnish for vegetables)

1. Six shallots.
2. Four onions, *maximum 3"/ 7.5cm diameter*, lightly trimmed.
3. Four onions, *over 3"/ 7.5cm diameter*, lightly trimmed.
4. Four bulbs of garlic, any variety.
5. Four potatoes, white.
6. Four potatoes, coloured.
7. Four potatoes salad.
8. Six French beans.
9. Six runner beans.
10. Longest runner bean.
11. Three carrots, washed but not scrubbed or trimmed.
12. Four apples of one variety, cooking.
13. Four apples of one variety, dessert.
14. Heaviest apple, any variety.
15. Four pears.
16. Four plums.
17. A saucer of soft fruit, with calyces attached, any variety.
18. Five tomatoes, with calyces attached, to be judged on flavour.
19. Five tomatoes, small fruited and cherry cultivars, with calyces attached, to be judged on flavour.
20. A pair of peppers (any colour or shape)
21. Four chillies (any type).
22. A pair of exotic vegetables, to be judged on individual quality. *An exotic vegetable is one not already named in the Schedule.*
23. Three beetroot, washed but not scrubbed or trimmed.
24. One cucumber, any variety.
25. Container of fresh culinary herbs (up to five named varieties) in water.
26. Heaviest marrow, any variety.
27. Three courgettes, any variety, *8"/20cm or less in length not including flower*.
28. Most unusually shaped vegetable (any type).

SECTION B: FLOWERS

29. Pot plant, flowering, including fuchsias, in a medium-sized pot, *maximum diameter 8"/20cm*.
30. Container of hydrangeas, three flowering stems with foliage, any variety.
31. Container of mixed perennial flowers, six stems, all different varieties.
32. Container of mixed annual flowers, six stems, at least three varieties.
33. Most sweetly scented bloom in a container.
34. Pelargonium in a pot *not more than 30cm/12' diameter*, any variety
35. One specimen rose, any variety, *in a container*, with or without foliage.
36. Container of four roses of more than one type.
37. One spray of a shrub rose (*to include floribundas*).
38. Container of sweet peas, six stems.
39. Container of dahlias, three cactus.
40. Container of dahlias, three stems of the same type (other than cactus) e.g. single, ball, pompom, etc.
41. One dahlia bloom, any variety.
42. Container of mixed foliage, *maximum width of display 12"/ 30cm*.
43. Collection of hosta leaves, *minimum of three different varieties*.
44. Container of three gladioli , any variety.
45. Container of seedheads, *minimum of three different varieties*.

SECTION C: FLOWER ARRANGING

Any exhibit which is not according to the Schedule will be disqualified. No artificial plant material to be included. Height is unlimited except in class 49.

46. Exhibit with accessories on the theme of the Platinum Jubilee. *Space allowed 2'/61cm*.
47. Arrangement of three garden-grown flowers plus foliage. *Space allowed 2'/61cm*.
48. Hand-tied posy. *Space allowed 1'/30cm*. Recommended presentation: in a jam jar with water.
49. Arrangement of wild flowers plus foliage. *Maximum space allowed 2'/61cm*
50. Arrangement in an eggcup. *Maximum 10cm/4" overall*.
51. Mixed garden flowers and foliage in a mug- any size.

SECTION D: COOKERY

Note: All entries should be made by the exhibitor. **Jam jars** should be shiny and clean and should not have trademarks. Each jar should have a waxed disc, be labelled with content and date of making, and have a sticker with the exhibitor's number on the bottom.

All food should be protected with cling film and presented on a plain paper plate with the exhibitor's number on the bottom.

52. Jar of marmalade.
53. Jar of jam made from fresh or dried fruit.
54. Jar of fruit curd, any type.
55. Jar of jelly, savoury or sweet.
56. Jar of chutney, any type.
57. Four ginger biscuits
58. Four savoury biscuits.
59. Small sourdough loaf.
60. Four cheese scones.
61. Swiss roll (with jam).
62. A vegetable-based cake, e.g. courgette, carrot, beetroot, etc.
63. A vegan cake (with ingredients listed separately)
64. Four pieces of flapjack
65. A savoury pasty of any kind.

SECTION E: DRINKS (Alcoholic and non-alcoholic)

Note: All entries should be made by the exhibitor. **Bottles** should be clear and should not have trademarks. Each bottle should be labelled with contents and date of making, and have a sticker with the exhibitor's number on the bottom.

66. Bottle of fruit or flower wine.
67. Bottle of cider.
68. Bottle of beer.
69. Bottle of fruit liqueur.
70. Bottle of fruit or flower cordial.
71. Bottle of lemonade.

SECTION F: HANDICRAFTS

Note: All entries should have been made by the exhibitor within the last two years and not submitted to the Show before.

72. Any item of needlework.
73. Any item of hand-knitting or crochet.
74. Any ceramic or wooden item you have made.

SECTION G: ART

Note: Entrants must be **12 or over**. A limit of two entries per person in any one class. All entries should have been made by the exhibitor within the last two years and not submitted to the Show before

75. Painting or drawing, any medium. *Maximum size 24"x24"/ 60cm x 60cm including frame.*

76. A three-dimensional piece of artwork, any material, any size.

SECTION H: PHOTOGRAPHS

Note: Entrants must be **12 or over**. A limit of two entries per person in any one class. All photographs to be taken by exhibitor and *to be unmounted and not exceed 5" x 7"/ 13cm x 18 cm*. Each photo should have the exhibitor's name and number on the back.

- 79. A bridge.
- 80. Food.

SECTION I: CHILDREN'S CLASSES (aged up to and including 6)

Note: In Section I, the age of the exhibitor should be stated on the entry form and on the front of the entry itself. Parents are asked to ensure that maximum sizes stated below are not exceeded.

- 81. A crown
- 82. A garden on a plate, *maximum size 11"/26cm diameter*.
- 83. An alien made of junk, *maximum size 18x18x18"/ 45x45x45cm*.
- 84. A decorated fairy cake. *To be judged on decoration alone*.
- 85. A painting of the Queen A4.
- 86. A picture based on a hand print, any medium and unframed, *maximum size 12"x 12"/30x30cm*.
- 87. A photograph of a favourite toy, *unmounted and not exceeding 5" x 7"/ 13x18 cm*. Each photo should have the exhibitor's name and number on the back.

SECTION J: CHILDREN'S CLASSES (aged 7 up to and including 11)

Note: In Section J, the age of the exhibitor should be stated on the entry form and on the front of the entry itself. Parents are asked to ensure that maximum sizes stated below are not exceeded.

- 89. A garden on a plate, *maximum size 11"/26cm diameter*.
- 90. An alien made of junk, *maximum size 18x18x18"/ 45x45x45cm*.
- 91. A decorated fairy cake. *To be judged on taste and decoration*.
- 92. A painting of the Queen, A4.
- 93. A picture based on a hand print, any medium and unframed, *maximum size 12"x 12"/30x30cm*.
- 94. A photograph of your favourite belonging, *unmounted and not exceeding 5" x 7"/ 13x18 cm*. Each photo should have the exhibitor's name and number on the back.

TROPHIES

The judges will have discretion not to award a trophy or certificate should there be no entries in a particular category or class regarded as being of sufficient quality.

Certificates (but no cash prizes except in the case of Children's Sections I and J) will be awarded to the competitors placed first, second and third in each class, although the judges will have the discretion to amalgamate classes within a section if the number of entries is low.

1. The Royal Horticultural Society's **Banksian Medal** will be awarded to the competitor who obtains the most points in the horticultural classes (Sections A and B). Competitors who won the Banksian Medal in the previous three Annual Shows, i.e. 2018, 2019, 2021, are not eligible to win this medal.
2. The "**Spenser Flower**" **Challenge Cup** for most points overall in all classes.
3. The **Ilmington Village Challenge Cup** for the most points in the horticultural classes (Sections A and B) obtained by a resident of Ilmington parish. The winner of the Banksian Medal and/or the Spenser Flower Challenge Cup will be ineligible.
4. The **1965 Challenge Cup** for the most points in the horticultural classes (Sections A and B) obtained by a non-resident of Ilmington parish. The winner of the Banksian Medal and/or the Spenser Flower Challenge Cup will be ineligible.
5. A **Challenge Cup** for the best exhibit of flowers in the Show (Section B).
6. The **Jubilee Cup** for the best exhibit in the vegetable & fruit classes (Section A).
7. The "**Bertie Wyton**" **Trophy** for the best exhibit by a resident of Ilmington parish in vegetable and fruit classes (Section A). The winner of the Jubilee Cup will be ineligible.
8. The **Woodland Pottery Trophy** for the best exhibit by a resident of Ilmington parish in the flower classes (Section B). The winner of the Challenge Cup will be ineligible.
9. The "**Christine Marland**" **Cup** for the best exhibit in the Rose classes.
11. The "**Hersey Flower**" **Trophy** for the most points in the flower arranging class (Section C).
12. The **Ladies Challenge Rose Bowl** for most points in the cookery and handicrafts classes (Sections D and F).
13. The **Howard Arms Trophy** for the best cookery exhibit by a child (aged 7

upwards) in Section J.

14. The **Handicrafts Cup** for the best exhibit in the handicraft classes (Section F).
15. The **J.J.W. Trophy** for the best photograph in Section H.
16. The “**Winifred Holman**” **Cup** for the best exhibit in the Children’s Classes (Sections I and J).
17. **Grace’s Cups** for most points in the Children’s Classes (Sections I and J).
18. The ‘**1959**’ **Trophy** for the most points in the Art classes (Section G).

RULES FOR COMPETITORS

1. Administration fee: 1-5 entries: £1.00 total
6-10 entries: £2.00 total
more than 10 entries: £3.00 total
no charge for entry to Children's classes (Sections I and J).
2. There will be no pre-registration. Registration of entries will be on the morning of the Show only between 8.30 and 10.00am.
3. All exhibits to be staged between 8.30am and 10.00am on the morning of the Show. Exhibits must not be removed before 4.30pm, but must be removed by 5.00pm. The Committee cannot take responsibility for any exhibits not collected from the tent.
4. The exhibitor will be responsible for attaching labels, marked with their exhibitor number, visibly on each entry and for correctly placing their entries in appropriate Section and Class.
5. All exhibits in Sections A and B must be grown in the exhibitor's garden.
6. The tent must be cleared by 10.00am on the morning of the Show when judging will commence.
7. Any objection must be made in writing to the Secretary before prize-giving. Prizes may then be withheld pending enquiries.
8. Any exhibitor may enter any number of exhibits in a class, except in Section H, but may not receive more than one prize in a class.
9. The decision of the judges shall be final.
10. While every care will be taken, the Committee cannot accept responsibility for any damage or loss which may occur. NB Photographs will be mounted with drawing pins.
11. Children may enter any of the classes in the schedule except Classes G and H but will be judged as adult competitors except in Children's Sections I and J.
12. Cup winners should ensure that cups are covered by their home insurance.
13. Entries "not for judging" will not be accepted.

ENTRY FORM

READ THIS: There will be no pre-registration. Each exhibitor should complete Parts A and B. Part B with the appropriate fee should be handed in on arrival on the day of the Show between 8.30 and 10.00am. Part A should be retained by the exhibitor as a record of their entries. Exhibitors will be given a strip of labels with their personal number on. The exhibitor will be responsible for attaching these labels visibly on each entry and for correctly placing their entries in appropriate Section and Class.

Administration fees: 1-5 entries: £1 total. 6-10 entries: £2 total. More than 10 entries: £3 total.
