

#### Easter - new beginnings?

Easter is the greatest festival of the Christian year, a time for new beginnings and fresh life. It's mirrored for us all around in this part of the world, as Spring is in full swing, but it's more than just a Spring festival. For Christians it represents the triumph of light over darkness and life over death as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Resurrection life is more than just a return to life it's about life in a new dimension. Not so much 'life after death' as 'life beyond death'.

That means it's about new beginnings rather than just picking up where things left off. It's about second chances, if you like, but with the added thought that a second chance isn't necessarily second best. Because of that, traditionally Easter was a time for the baptism of new Christians, a custom that survived for many centuries, and until quite recently, in the gift of new clothes at Easter. It was a time for a fresh start.

After the last few years many of us feel in need of a fresh start. Why not use this Easter as a time for doing something about that? The life, death and resurrection of Jesus offers purpose and meaning to life – and to life beyond death as well. I hope we shall be able to explore that in an Alpha Course in the parishes later in the year, but in the meantime if you'd like have a chat anyway, do use the email or phone contacts for me printed on other pages in the magazine.

And in the meantime, Happy Easter!

#### **Nature Notes April 2023**

A rainbow is a beautiful sight to see. There is something special about it. We know that when it rains and the sun is out we will see one. A rainbow is caused by sunlight and atmospheric conditions. Light enters a water droplet, slowing down and bending as it goes from air to denser water. The light reflects off the inside of the droplet, separating into its component wavelengths--or colours, making a rainbow. A double rainbow appears when light is reflected twice in a raindrop. Amazingly no two people see the same rainbow. That's because a rainbow has no appearance – its precise shape, arc, and the width of its colour bands –

will be slightly different according to the eye of the beholder. That means every rainbow is unique to you! It was God who gave us the rainbow as a promise that He would never flood the whole earth again so when we see the rainbow, we can remember His promise. Genesis Ch 9. *Gill*

#### Neighbourhood Plan, almost there. March 2023

## The Plan has been examined by Louise Brooke-Smith OBE FRICS MRTPI.

The examiner was extremely complementary about the Plan and recommended it move to immediate referendum subject to minor amendments and corrections. These have been done and the final referendum version of the Plan, along with a copy of the Inspector's report, can be viewed at Tredingtonnp.co.uk. Ninety-nine per cent of the plan has been accepted including the designation of the land at the end of Heron Way, Newbold-on-Stour, as a Local Green Space. The Plan and its appendices have been passed to Stratford District Council for a final check; once that is complete, the District Council will arrange a referendum. Unfortunately the forthcoming Council elections in May will delay the process. We hope that the referendum will be sometime in June. The result will be determined on a "first past the post" basis and a good turnout will add weight to the outcome. All residents of the Parish will be eligible to vote so please do so. The outcome of the referendum will be Reported to a meeting of the District Council which has the authority to approve the Plan. Once the Council has accepted the result of the referendum, the Plan is 'made'. From that point forward the District Council must, by law, take the provisions of the Plan into consideration when determining planning applications. The document is a reflection of your views and is, therefore, extremely important in shaping the communities within the Parish in the years to come. Deborah Williams

#### Notes from a Small Church in a Field

Some twenty-five years ago a local initiative based in Shropshire launched a project to promote churchyards as conservation areas. 'Caring for God's Acre' was eventually established as a national charity in 2000, and in 2022 St Mary's Whitchurch joined the initiative. Our churchyard is now being managed with the objective of improving its value for biodiversity by providing a variety of habitats for plants, mammals, birds, insects and reptiles. We're following the charity's published advice in much of the churchyard. But we will also be keeping the area on either side of the pathway to the church door and around recent graves regularly mown. The churchyard is already host to various birds, including greater spotted woodpeckers, and common butterflies like brimstone, meadow brown, and gatekeeper. Last year we saw a return in profusion of cowslips, cyclamen and wild garlic. In this second year under the new churchyard management plan, we're looking forward to finding even more species.
